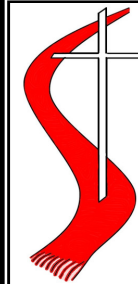

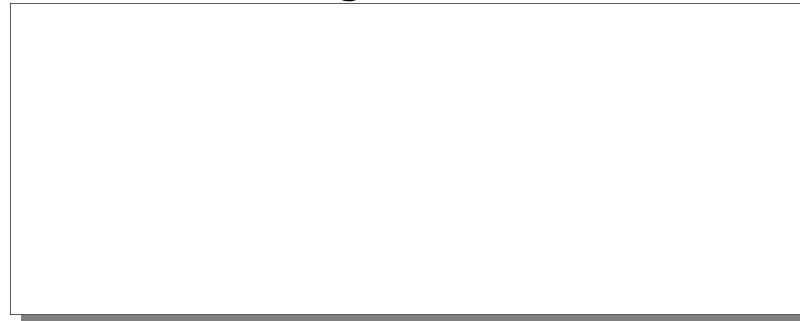

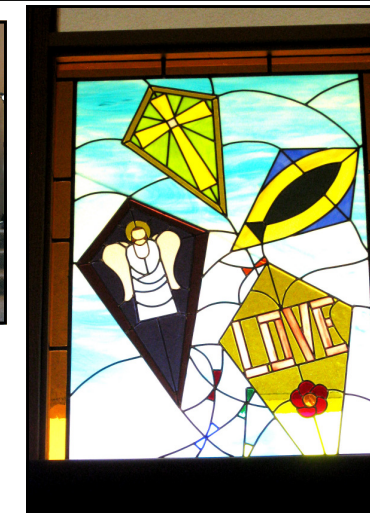

CAL-PAC ANNUAL CONFERENCE WAS HELD JUNE 17 - 20TH BE 2009 ANNUAL CONFERENCE SUMMARY

More than 1,700 laity and clergy from across Southern California, Hawaii, Guam, and Saipan gathered June 17 to 20 at the University of Redlands in Redlands, Calif., for the 2009 California-Pacific Annual Conference. This year's theme continued the Conference's vision "To Be the Cup Overflowing," with this year reflecting the first of the denominational Four Areas of Focus on "Leadership."

During the service of ordination and sending, Bishop Mary Ann Swenson recalled Jesus' words that disciples are to be "the salt of the earth," and encouraged those to be ordained and commissioned to be sure their ministry includes doing work "that makes you sweaty—and therefore truly salty. Take a shovel in your hands, pick up a hammer...and work up a sweat on a mission project overseas or in your own neighborhood... Be truly salty, and you will stay in touch with "those whom we are called to serve."

This was the 25th Annual Conference Session of the California-Pacific Annual Conference, which was created out of the Pacific and Southwest Annual Conference. This session marks

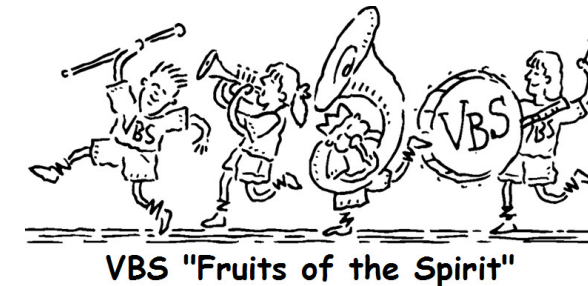
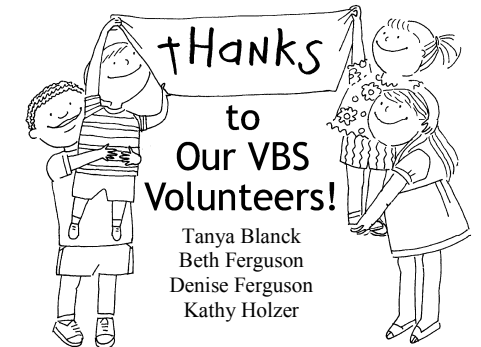

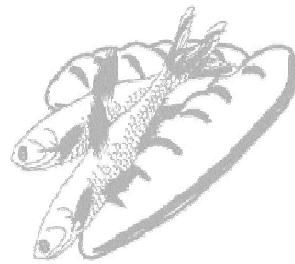

A HEIFER MENAGERIE

A water buffalo, a pig, a trio of rabbits, and a Flock of Hope (chicks, ducklings, and goslings) – what do these have in common?? They have all been donated by St. Matthew's children to Heifer International after only half a year of offering collection!

Water buffalo are amongst the most prized livestock for many farming families around the world. First, they provide pulling power – farmers can grow four times more crops than if plowing by hand. Second, water buffalos give families an instant source of nutrition from their rich milk. And third, buffalo manure can be used as an organic fertilizer to increase crop production. All this adds up to more food and more income to go toward essentials like clothing, medicine, and education – proving that sometimes the best gifts come in really BIG packages.

the 158th session since the organization of The Pacific Conference in 1851, the oldest of the merging Annual Conferences.

The Rev. Dr. Randy Maddox from the Divinity School at Duke University led Bible study focusing on leadership. He focused on leadership as it relates to his specialty of Wesleyan theology. He asked both clergy and laity, "When you're in leadership, toward what are we leading?" Maddox said the church is called to a holistic salvation that draws wisdom from our Wesleyan traditions.

The Conference continued a pattern of welcoming a lay person to preach during the Annual Session. Ruth Pitts-Litman, a lay member of Palm Springs United Methodist Church, was selected through an audition process. Pitts-Litman, who recently lost her husband, preached from Acts 1:8 titling her sermon, "Let the Spirit Find You." She challenged those gathered to study Christ's teaching and practice them.

Members adopted at 2010 apportionment budget of \$12,897,982 representing a .06 percent decrease from 2009. The budget reflected other action by the conference to begin having retired clergy members share in the cost of their health insurance for the first time.

More than 250 youth participated in the annual Youth Day.

During the Service of Commissioning, Ordination, and Sending Forth, Bishop Mary Ann Swenson welcomed Rabbi Mark Diamond. Rabbi Diamond is the Executive Vice President of the Board of Rabbis of Southern California. In that position, he directs a multi-denominational organization of 290 rabbis, and serves on the management team of the Jewish Federation of Greater Los Angeles. He told those gathered for ordination that leaders dream dreams and interpret duties.

During the 16th Annual Conference Missionary Luncheon, the Conference was presented a plaque from The Advance for the highest designated giving and highest total amount of missionary support in 2008 in the Western Jurisdiction of the United Methodist Church.

In other business, conference members:

- Collected offerings: Grace Children's Hospital in Haiti \$4,630; Central Conference Pension \$3,200; and Visiting Doctors' Hospital Program in Vietnam \$4,335; and, \$1,900 for youth programs;
- Raised \$2,000 for 36 UMCOR buckets; and,
- Accepted health and sewing kits for the UMCOR West Depot.

During the conference session:

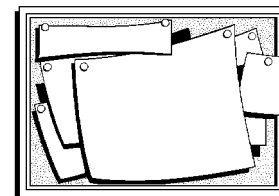
- Bishop Swenson ordained 10 elders in full connection; commissioned 9 as probationary elders, ordained one deacon in full connection, and commissioned one as a probationary deacon;
- Celebrated the retirement of 15 active clergy; and,
- Members rejoiced when Bishop Swenson baptized two infants.

Membership stands at 82405, down 2411 from the previous year. Worship attendance stands at 48881, down 2275. Church school attendance stands at 12726, down 68.

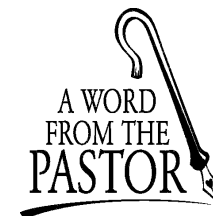

THE SHEPHERD'S PEN

Dear Friends,

In the article from the Circuit West, included in this edition of the Good News, we have a good summary of the Cal-Pac Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church held in June. We at St. Matthew's UMC are not just a church unto ourselves, but rather we are part of a worldwide denomination. Once every 4 years the General Conference of the United Methodist Church meets with delegates coming from all over the world. At that conference, they discuss the work of our United Methodist Church which is occurring all over the world. From the General Conference, we get updated legislation for our United Methodist Book of Discipline which orders our life together as a denomination. We also get the general theme out of which new ministries may spring and established ministries get fresh focus. At our Annual Conference in Redlands California, we learned about Four Areas of Focus, related to the Open doors part of the previous theme of Open hearts, Open minds, and Open doors.

The theme at Annual Conference this year was "The Cup Overflowing: Leadership". I now realize that it was pointed at the first of the Four Areas of Focus. The four areas are: Leadership Development, Church Growth, Ministry with the Poor, and Global Health. These express the vision and yearnings of the people of The United Methodist Church. They put our attention on specific in making disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world by:

- Developing principled Christian leaders for the church and the world.
- Creating new places for new people and revitalizing existing congregations.
- Engaging in ministry with the poor.
- Combating the diseases of poverty by improving health globally.

To my way of thinking these are all things we are already doing but can consider if we could enhance or improve or include something we may be missing. I would like to think that they all fit into what Jesus said about when, "the Son of Man comes in His glory... Then the King will say to those on His right, 'Come, you who are blessed of My Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave Me something to eat; I was thirsty and you gave Me drink; I was a stranger, and you invited Me in; naked, and you clothed Me; I was sick, and you visited Me; I was in prison, and you came to Me.' Then the righteous will answer Him saying, 'Lord when did we see you...?' And the King will answer and say to them, 'Truly I say to you, to the extent that you did it to one of these brothers of Mine, even the least of them, you did it to Me.'" NASB Matthew 25:31a, 34-37a, 40. It seems to me if we look close enough, then we will see all Four Areas of Focus. Good focus. Now may God help us not to be hearers of the word only, but also to be doers of the word.
