Homeless Feeding on December 20.

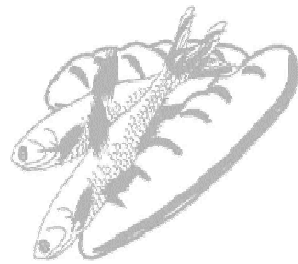

SAFETY FIRST

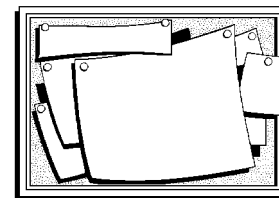

Someone once said that the best cure is prevention. That is what these monthly articles are all about. But what if you take the prevention route and someone is still injured. You better have a good first aid kit. Here is the list of items recommended by the American Red Cross.

- Sterile, adhesive bandages in assorted sizes
- Cleaning agent/ soap and antiseptic
- Latex gloves
- Sunscreen
- 2 inch and 4 inch gauze pads (4-6)
- 2 inch and 3 inch roller bandages (3 rolls each)
- Adhesive tape
- Scissors, tweezers and needle
- Rubbing alcohol
- Thermometer
- Tube of petroleum jelly or other lubricant

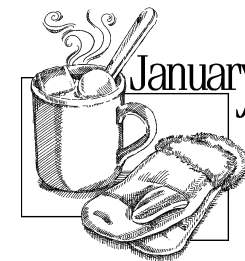
It is my prayer that you will need to replenish this kit because the items become outdated, not because you had to use them.

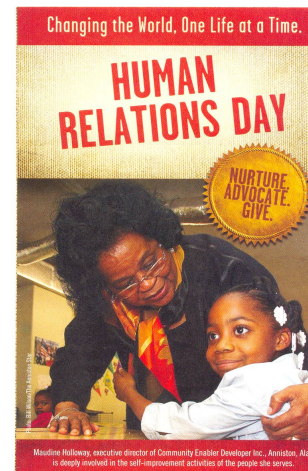

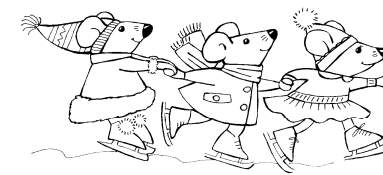

THE SHEPHERD'S PEN



Dear Friends,

The Dean of Students at Fuller Theological Seminary told a story in chapel while I was there. There was a student who told him, "If I buy the student accident & health insurance isn't that showing a lack of faith in God. I am going to trust God to keep me safe and well." The Dean told the student, "Buy the insurance and trust God for the premium." Over the past 33 years, I have served seven churches. It seems in all of them there was a struggle between what is and what is hoped for. Some would say, "Pass the budget and trust God to provide." Others would say, "How can we pass a budget when the pledges and other expected income won't cover it?" As the Pastor, I always found myself in the middle. I attempted to help these two groups to understand and accept each other. Perhaps the tension comes from the teaching of our Lord. On the one hand in the midst of a terrible storm he said, "Where is your faith?" On the other hand he said, "Suppose one of you wants to build a tower. Will he not first sit down and estimate the cost to see if he has enough money to complete it?" That's the kind of tension we were under when we met recently to finalize and vote on the proposed budget for 2010.

The various ministry teams within our church gave their budget proposals to our Finance Committee. The Finance Committee had in hand the pledges for 2010 and records of other giving in the past. The budget was what might be called a growth budget. When the Finance Committee compared the proposed expenditures with the estimated income they were at a loss as to how to balance the budget. After an hour of trying to think of some way to reconcile the figures, they decided to seek the help of the Church Council.

The budget was the only scheduled business. After an hour of discussing possible solutions, we turned to our Finance Committee Chairman. He began by acknowledging the great success of our Capital Campaign.

He went on to say that if all the pledges for 2009 had been paid we would have finished the year on budget and ahead by a little. He felt we did better than expected in light of the recession. Then he reluctantly made his proposal for balancing the budget. We were short by \$36,000. Some parts of the budget were zeroed out. Others were cut by 25%. Some increase in staff salary had to be cut and for the first time in years we cut an already Conference reduced Apportionment by \$6,270. No one was happy about paying less than 100% of our Apportionment. It represents a significant portion of our mission beyond our local church. In the end the budget was balanced at \$190,830 which was \$28,839 less than the budget for 2009. This is a more realistic figure from a cost accounting point of view. We stand with Jesus on estimating the cost completion teaching. We all agreed that God may yet bless our efforts to minister. Each ministry team will still decide how to use their remaining budget.

So what have I learned over my 33 years of ministry? I may never be able to convince either the "trust God group" or the "realistic estimate group". I would point out that "pledges" are an act of faith. No one knows what next year will bring. In that sense, our Finance Committee was acting on faith even to recommend the budget adopted by the Church Council. The budget will be published with 2009 listed, the asked for budget for 2010, the adjustments, and the revised 2010 budget. After seeing it, perhaps some will consider increasing their faith commitment (pledge). Don't do it for the wrong reason! "For if the willingness is there, the gift is acceptable according to what one has, not according to what he does not have." 2 Corinthians 8:12 NIV.
